



We hereby confirm the conformity of the products manufactured and distributed by us with

1. Regulation (EC) 1907/2006 (REACH)¹ and
2. the German regulation restricting the use of hazardous substances in electric and electronic equipment (ElektroStoffV).²

Reg. 1. All products manufactured by us either do not contain any substances requiring registration pursuant to REACH, or are pre-registered or registered by our suppliers. As a rule, our products do not contain any substances causing concern pursuant to the SVHC list. In the event that a product contains a higher concentration of a substance causing concern than is admissible according to REACH, we will indicate this fact in the associated product documents.

Reg. 2. Our products are designed exclusively for non-private use (B2B) and are mainly applied, in an industrial production context, as components of "stationary industrial jigs / large tools"³ and in the environment of such jigs / large tools. As a consequence, they are not subject to the requirements applicable under the ElektroStoffV (German Regulation restricting the Use of Hazardous Substances in Electric and Electronic Equipment). The only exceptions are the following products delivered by us: Control units and power controllers, Plast Sprint, CPR, CPC, mould jetting devices, quick response thermometers, solid state relays, ventilators and ultrasonic flow measuring devices. We will be pleased to make the corresponding declarations of conformity, relating to the aforementioned products, separately available to you if required.

¹ Regulation EC 1907/2006 (REACH), which has entered into force on 1 June 2007, is immediately applicable in all EU member states as an EU Regulation and has not been implemented explicitly into national law.

² The national regulation restricting the use of hazardous substances in electric and electronic equipment (ElektroStoffV), which has entered into force on 9 May 2013, is based on EU Regulations R2002/95/EC (WEEE) and 2011/65/EU (ROHS II), formerly 2002/96/EC (ROHS), and implements them into national law. On entering into force, ElektroStoffV also replaces the previously applicable law on the initial circulation, return and environmentally compatible disposal of electric and electronic equipment (ElektroG) dated 16 March 2005, which had already implemented the requirements under EU Regulations WEEE and ROHS from the year 2002 into national law.

³ We deliberately use the term "stationary industrial jigs / large tools" within the meaning of §2 no. 2 ElektroStoffV.
